

RE: ESC-0335-24-Telehealth Safety Net Clinic

In reference to Solicitation ESC-0335-24 Telehealth Safety Net Clinic, the Mayor's Office Health Programs and Initiatives recommends awarding Telescope Health. The services will require a formal contract through the office of the General Counsel. The terms of this agreement are for one (1) year from the date of the executed contract with two (2) one (1) year renewal options upon satisfactory performance by the contractor.

The bid opened on March 20, 2024, and Procurement received four (4) vendor responses: Telescope Health, Triagelogic, Physician Account Managers, and Universal Solutions Group. Telescope Health earned the highest ranking of the three bids.

The project funding allocation is \$2,185,000. The funds will be used to improve healthcare access for the uninsured with a virtual platform. This would reduce some of the negative social determinants of health, such as transportation, cost, and lack of health insurance impacting access to care. It will provide a 24 hour/7 day a week triage hotline with on demand virtual visits and will plan follow-up through the JaxCare Connect-Duval Safety Net Collaborative. The proposed services will not duplicate existing services.

(Specific Information Regarding this RFP)

1.1 Introduction

The City of Jacksonville (“Buyer”) intends to hire an individual or firm (“Contractor”) to provide the services described in Section 1.2 of this Request for Proposal (“RFP”). Persons interested in submitting a response to this RFP (a “Response”) should carefully review this RFP for instructions on how to respond and for the applicable contractual terms. In the event of conflicting provisions, the following sections of this RFP will have priority in the order listed: Section 1, Section 4, Section 2, Section 3, the Attachments, and the Forms.

1.2 Scope of Services.

The Mayor’s Office is accepting proposals from qualified organizations to serve as a Telemedicine provider for the uninsured population in Health Zone 1 (zip codes include 32208, 32209, 32206, 32254, 32204 and 32202).

Please see Section 4 for a full description of the services and deliverables required under this RFP.

1.3 Term of Agreement.

The initial term of agreement will commence upon execution of the Contract and will continue for a period one (1) year. Buyer will have the option to renew such agreement for up to two (2) additional one (1) year renewal options upon satisfactory performance by Contractor. The Contract is subject to early termination as set forth elsewhere in this RFP.

1.4 Minimum Requirements for Contractors.

Contractors must satisfy the following mandatory minimum requirements in order to have their Responses evaluated. By submitting a Response, Contractor warrants and represents that it satisfies these requirements. Failure to meet these requirements and provide written documentation at the time of bid opening will result in the Response not being evaluated and being rejected as non-responsive:

1. Organization must have a Telemedicine/Telehealth infrastructure in place in Duval County or surrounding counties.
2. Organization must provide three (3) references from clients who have utilized the program in the last 3-5 years.

Section 4 Description of Services and Deliverables

1. Scope, Background and Invitation:

The City of Jacksonville (COJ) is seeking an entity, organization, firm to serve as a Telemedicine provider for the uninsured population in Health Zone 1 (zip codes include 32208, 32209, 32206, 32254, 32204, and 32202).

Approximately 13.8% of the adults in Duval County are uninsured, leaving more than 120,000 people without health insurance. Based on the 2020 census an estimated 47,000 individuals in Duval County are uninsured AND living under 200% of the federal poverty level.

The vast majority of these individuals use the emergency room as their source of health care. In fact, a recent study suggests 76.1% of clients who came through a safety net primary care program utilized the emergency room between one and three times in the previous year. Of these, 48.9% use the emergency room for a minor illness; 31% would simply not seek care for such a minor concern.

An emergency room visit costs approximately \$4,200 based on results from the federally qualified health care report in 2019. If the patient is uninsured, this cost is paid by the COJ taxpayers.

32% clients using the Duval Safety Net stated that transportation and another 29.7% suggested that language was a barrier to accessing care.

The City of Jacksonville (COJ) partner with an outside entity to improve access to healthcare with a robust telehealth/virtual safety net program.

2. Specific Services include, but are not limited to the following:

A) A 24-hour, seven day a week multi-lingual navigation care team that works/coordinates with all city health care partners including the Duval Safety Net Organizations, such as through JaxCare Connect or the 998 Mental Health Collaborative.

B) On Demand preventative and transitional care with EMR documentation that can be accessible to healthcare systems and safety net clinics.

C) Collaborate with local mental health resources.

D) COJ hotline number called and followed by appropriate triage for services (pt treated virtually, referred to safety-net clinic, mental health resources provided, ER, or 911)

E) The Telemedicine contacted organization will make arrangements for follow-up with the patients PC or will arrange appointment through JaxCare Connect to one of the Duval Safety Net clinics.

F) A social determinants of health assessment must be done at the initiation of the call. This will also allow factors to be flagged for further investigation or referrals.

3. Vendor Qualifications:

A) Previous experience in working with the City or Jax or other large municipalities while providing virtual services.

B) Understand the diverse population that will be served and the need for innovation to reach the unreachable underserved population.

EVALUATION MATRIX

The evaluations will be based upon the following criteria, and Contractors are requested to provide, as a minimum, the information listed under each criterion. **Failure to provide adequate information on any criterion will result in lower scores and could result in rejection of the proposal as non-responsive. Contractors are encouraged to arrange their responses in a format that will offer ready review and evaluation of each criterion.**

- 1) **COMPETENCE.** Including professional and/or technical education and training; experience in the kind of projects to be undertaken; availability of adequate personnel, equipment and facilities and the extent of repeat business of the persons. Provide names and resumes of all individuals to be assigned to this project. List previous projects similar to the one in the RFP, which have been satisfactorily completed. Provide resumes of principal staff/project manager showing years of experience in the field to which they are assigned for this project. **(20 points maximum score)**
- 2) **CURRENT WORKLOAD.** Provide the number and size of the projects currently being performed. Discuss past ability to deliver projects on a timely basis under similar current workload conditions. **(10 points maximum score)**
- 3) **FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY.** Describe form of business, i.e., proprietorship, partnership, corporation; years in business; changes in ownership; bank reference(s); past, present, pending and/or threatened legal proceedings within any forum; and any other information the Contractor may wish to supply to demonstrate financial responsibility. Failure to provide all listed information and documentation will result in a score less than maximum for this criterion. **(10 points maximum score)**
- 4) **PAST AND PRESENT RECORD OF PROFESSIONAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS WITH CITY AGENCIES AND OTHERS.** Describe any outstanding accomplishments that relate to specific services being sought including awards and recognition. **(5 points maximum score)**
- 5) **PROXIMITY TO THE PROJECT.** Document the location of Contractor's corporate headquarters, which, if located in Jacksonville, Florida, no further information is required under this criterion and maximum points will be awarded. If Contractor's corporate headquarters are not located in Jacksonville, Florida, please document the location and the nature of business of Contractor's branch office(s), if any, that are located in and/or that are closest to Jacksonville, Florida, the number of employees assigned thereto and the period of continuous existence thereof. Additionally, Contractors are requested to demonstrate, define and provide examples of their ability to provide the services contemplated herein in a manner comparable to having a local office in Jacksonville, Florida or to show that a local office is not necessary to satisfactorily perform the services required for this project, in which event maximum points may be awarded. **(15 points maximum score)**
- 6) **ABILITY TO DESIGN AN APPROACH AND WORK PLAN TO MEET THE PROJECT REQUIREMENTS.** Describe the Contractor's understanding of the requirements of this solicitation, and its ability, approach and/or plan to satisfy the same in complete compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations. **(20 points maximum score)**
- 7) **BUDGET (20 points maximum score)**
The City's Complete Count Committee is seeking a proposal that offers significant value and maximum impact. The proposal will be evaluated on the allocation of resources within the budget allowed and the level of service, including enhanced services, and value included in the proposed budget.

Prepare and submit a detailed proposed budget corresponding to the above described plan, and based on the Scope of Work and available budget. Such proposed budget shall not only identify the allocation of resources but shall clearly identify the allocation of resources between overhead, in-house staff and facilities, subcontractors, and other purchases. The actual contractual budget will be based on the agreed upon scope of work and budgetary limitations imposed on the City's Complete Count Committee as part of its budget approval process with the City. Provide a budget breakdown that clearly reflects:

- Amount of proposed budget allocated to buildings, equipment, and general overhead
- Amount of proposed budget allocated to staffing and number of employees by job category
- Allocation of the proposed budget of all resources needed.
